Intensive Outpatient Program

IOP stands for intensive outpatient program. It is an intensive program for persons who have a chemical addiction and are in need of services more intensive than weekly counseling, yet are better served in the community. The IOP addictions program provides therapy for at least nine hours each week on at least four different days.
