Q&A

Will I have to tell why I am in the class? **No.**

How long does the class last? **About one hour.**

Will I get a free prescription for the antidote (Naloxone / Narcan)?

Yes, after you complete the course.

Why is the class being offered?

The county, state and country are in the midst of an epidemic. More people are dying of overdoses than in car crashes or suicides.

Where can someone get treatment for a drug addiction?

There are many treatment facilities. Start by calling the Garrett County Health Department at 301-334-7670.

What if I only want to take the class and not get the antidote?

No problem. We can give it to someone else.

Is this class only for people with an addiction?

No, the class is also for persons who care about persons who may have addiction, and they don't want to see them die.

What if I can't come to a class at the time that is scheduled?

No problem. We will take your contact information and call you when there is a time that might better fit your schedule.

WHO?

Persons who may accidentally overdose.

Persons who could be in the presence of a drug overdose.

Persons wanting to take the training are often in this situation because of their:

- Occupation
- Volunteer Work
- Family Member
- Social Experience
